

We wish them every success in their journey ahead and are proud that they are equipped to succeed in whichever path they choose.




CLASS OF 2020 ACADEMIC RESULTS

In 2020, 374 students completed their Year 12 studies; 56% of our Year 12 students studied the VCE, and 44% studied the IB DP.


2020 ATAR Comparison






TERTIARY DESTINATIONS
